Kathryn Damiano

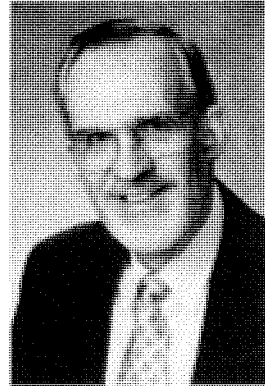
Kathryn is a Quaker and life long contemplative. As a teacher of in-depth spiritual life studies and retreat leader, she sees her ministry as working for peace and justice through spiritual formation.

Kathryn has been a spiritual director for 25 years and has served in this capacity at Pendle Hill, a Quaker center for study and contemplation. She co-founded The School of the Spirit, a two-year offering, similar to the Academy for Spiritual Formation. Her formal training consists of a Master of Divinity from United Theological Seminary (United Methodist), a Masters in counseling psychology, an internship in spiritual direction at the Jesuit Renewal Center and a Ph.D. in spiritual theology.

Kathryn moved from Philadelphia to Wichita, Kansas 9 years ago to join the Friends of Jesus Community. Their ministry was living in a low-income area of the city to be a presence to promote interracial reconciliation. Presently she and her husband live in a solar home for which they did most of the construction and Xeriscaping (using drought for resistant native plants.)

Dr. Mulholland comes to us as an adjunct faculty member of The Academy of Spiritual Formation of the Upper Room.

The majority of Mulholland's professional career has been spent in academe as professor and Dean at Asbury Theological Seminary and as an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church.

Bob has ten books to his credit in addition to more than fifty articles, papers and chapters in books. Likewise his travels and ministry have taken him worldwide visiting or ministering in more than fifty countries. His areas of study and teaching include biblical languages and literature, early church history in the Roman Empire, as well as numerous New Testament studies.

Bob speaks of a spiritual journey that began as a confirmed atheist who experienced "a profound emptiness at the core of my being" until "God graciously manifested God's presence to me as I was on the verge of suicide."

Dr. Mulholland is an engaging speaker who brings a wealth of knowledge and deep spiritual presence.

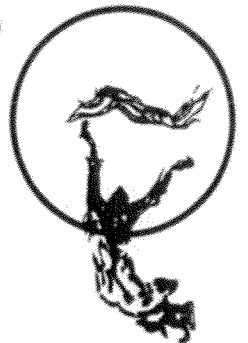
